

The course is PD894 – *Literacy Empowerment Makes a Difference X* under the University of Guam, GLE. The Instructor is Dr. Matilda Naputi Rivera (mnrivera@triton.uog.edu) and Co-Facilitator, Martha Sudo (mjsudo@gmail.com)

Description: By attending the monthly meetings of the GC-ILA, students will be provided with resourceful strategies to increase literacy in diverse classroom settings. The sessions will allow teachers, administrators, or media specialists, to gather ideas for effective literacy instruction, tools, and best practices. There will be formal sessions, informal venues, and networking areas to help students achieve their goals and expand their own understanding.

Requirements:

- •Must be a current GC-ILA Member \$25 membership

- •UOG \$20 Recording Fee UOG GLE (Global Learning and Engagement)

- •Conduct one (1) Story Time Read Aloud with the ILA/D204 Lions Clubs International partnership via Zoom. Read Alouds may also be pre-recorded.

Registration for the course will take place at GC-ILA's meetings on September 9 and October 27, 2023.


Get Literacy Resources with a \$500 Grant!
