





























Pearl Hamada Yonamine

In SY 2019 - 2020, she taught 4th grade.


Literacy Matters: How Can We Support Literacy Growth For Our Children?"

Need a Grad Credit for Recertification?



Description: By attending the monthly meetings of the GC-ILA, students will be provided with resourceful strategies to increase literacy in diverse classroom settings. Dear Ms. Sudo,

Thank you for your encouragement to promote literacy in reading to the children of Kwajalein Atoll.

I have just returned in January of this year back to Guam after ending 5+ years of teaching and teacher training to the Public School System in the Republic of the Marshall Islands, specific to Kwajalein Atoll. RMI is comprised of approximately 29 atolls (low-lying islands). Kwajalein is one of them. It is stated to be the largest atoll lagoon in the world encompassing 655 square miles. Kwajalein atoll is comprised of 97 islands / islets. There are 5 schools located in various islands, Ebeye being the main island alone with 8 schools ranging from K-12.

With this geographic bird's-eye view, there are many children in the remote islets still learning how to read. Tests results, although improving, still place below average. If given the right learning tools, I believe their success rate may accelerate. For that reason, I am returning with a Reading Mastery program in March for 2 weeks. However, they need books to practice their reading skills, especially in the early learning years starting with Kindergarten through Middle School. It is rare for each classroom to have a set aside mainly for that purpose.

Hence, on behalf of Kwajalein Atoll Public School System and all the private schools, I humbly appeal to you for help with any donations pertaining to resourceful reading materials for the school children. The parents, community and teachers will truly appreciate this act of generosity.
