- Saturday, January 13 RAT 2024 Kick-Off at the Agana Shopping Center, from 10:00 a.m. 1:00 p.m.
- Tuesday, January 16 Distribution of RAT 2024 Pledge Card. Students can begin recording their reading time and collect pledges from January 13 February 24, 2024.
- School Reps may begin reading activities at their respective schools PROMOTING READING!
- Thursday, February 22, 2024 or earlier Students turn in RAT pledge cards and monies collected to their respective teacher, who will in turn submit to their School Rep.
- Saturday, February 24, 2024 DEADLINE FOR REPS TO TURN IN ON-TIME PLEDGE MONIES IS 12:00 NOON, to be eligible to win the Top Prizes, for students, teachers, and Reps. Student pledge monies turned in after the deadline will not be eligible for the Top Prizes.
- Following the official counting of pledge monies, winners will be announced and Top Prizes will be awarded.
- March 9, 2024 8:00 a.m. 10:00 a.m. PRIZE DISTRIBUTION For School Reps to pick up prizes for his/her students at JM Guerrero Elementary School Cafeteria.




Get Literacy Resources with a \$500 Grant!

Dear Parent or Guardian,

The Guam Council of the International Literacy Association (ILA) is pleased to announce that **Read-A-Thon (RAT) 2024** will be held during the weeks of **January 13 – February 24, 2024.** This year's theme is **Read-A-Thon 2024 – "Unfold Your Wings: READ MORE!"** This annual, island-wide fundraiser directly benefits the students and teachers from Guam's public, private, parochial schools and daycares.

HOW IS THE MONEY USED?

- Over 95% is returned to students, teachers, and their respective schools in the form of books, prizes, classroom libraries, and teacher grants.
- The remaining money is used for the operational expenses of our local council, such as author/illustrator visits, professional development, and numerous school and community projects that promote reading and develop literacy.

HOW DO PARENTS AND STUDENTS PARTICIPATE?

- If you'd like your child to participate in Read-A-Thon (RAT) 2024, please sign and return the permission slip to
 your child's teacher by Friday, January 26, 2024, or earlier. Your signature gives your child permission to solicit
 and receive pledges. All students participating in Read-A-Thon 2024 will receive a pledge card.
- 2. By signing the pledge card, students in 2nd grade or younger "pledge" to read, or be read to, for at least three hours during Read-A-Thon 2024 while those in 3rd grade and above pledge to read for at least six hours. Parents/Guardians are encouraged to actively participate in Read-A-Thon 2024 along with their children by reading to, and with them, taking them to the public library's story hour, or listening to them read.
- 3. From January February 22, 2024, students will solicit pledges. Parents/Guardians are kindly asked to monitor their child's collection of money, and submit the amount collected to their child's teacher with the pledge card. Pledges may be made through IRA Read-a-thon PayPal account: guamreadathon@gmail.com (select Friends and Family). Under NOTES, please indicate child's name, teacher's name, school, grade, and contact information. 12:00 noon. There is a minimum amount needed to qualify for the top ten prizes. The list of participation prizes and top ten prizes are included. Full participation of students to determine teacher winners will be based on \$5 minimum, pledge card submission and on time money submission. While the money-raising aspect of Read-A-Thon 2024 is important, the Guam Council of the International Literacy Association asks all parents/guardians to continually emphasize the importance of reading. Therefore, students are encouraged to keep track of their reading time during Read-A-Thon 2024 even if they are not soliciting pledges.
